AGE DEMOGRAPHICS:

Amelia County is a strong rural community located just 41 miles southwest of Richmond, the State Capitol of Virginia and rich in American history. Covering 359 square miles, 69% of the population live and work in the area. Over the last decade the county's population has increased by 14.8%. It is expected to grow another 2.4% by 2025 as the population of Metro Richmond expands towards it.

Amelia County residents enjoy many opportunities for hunting and fishing and local dining establishments. In addition, you live within proximity to metro-Richmond area retail shops, entertainment, fine dining, museums and other cultural attractions as well as the best doctors and hospitals along the east coast.

Amelia County has the 5th lowest tax burden of any county in the nation within a top 50 metro area, thus making it an ideal place for a home or a business. The most common forms of employment are in health care, retail trade, construction, and manufacturing. The county also has a large agricultural presence which produces the 8th largest agricultural sales in Virginia. A 30-minute commute will bring you into the Richmond metropolitan area. High speed internet is being implemented enabling people to work remotely.

CHURCHES/PLACES OF WORSHIP


- Up to 26% of population report no faith involvement.
