> conveniently located near I-79 and US 19, referred to by many residents as a "Crossroads Community."


Harmony is a quaint German village of old brick and log buildings, designated a National Historic


Landmark District in 1974. There are more than 50 preserved buildings in the historic district.

White collar workers make up 73% of the workforce.


The area is served by the Seneca Valley School District, a top 10% district in PA.
