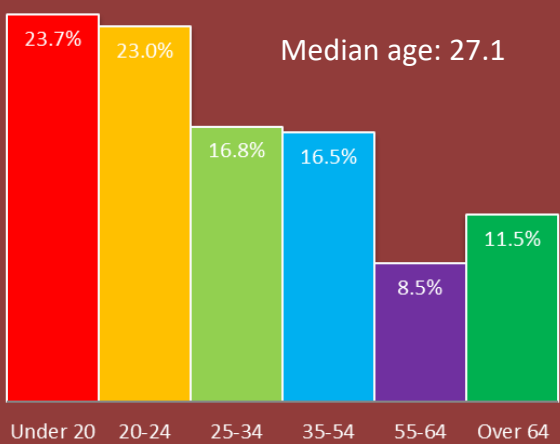

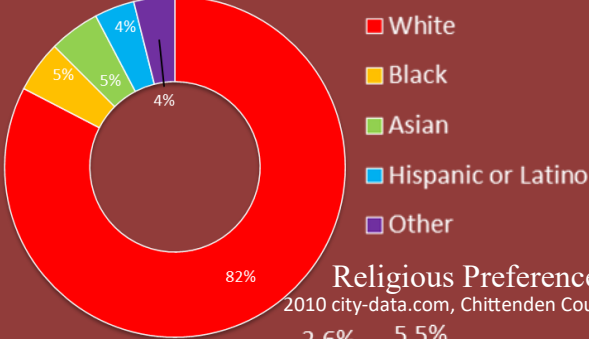

Age Demographics

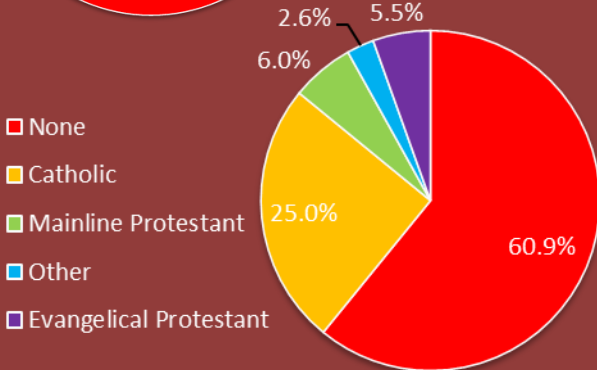


Racial/Ethnic Diversity

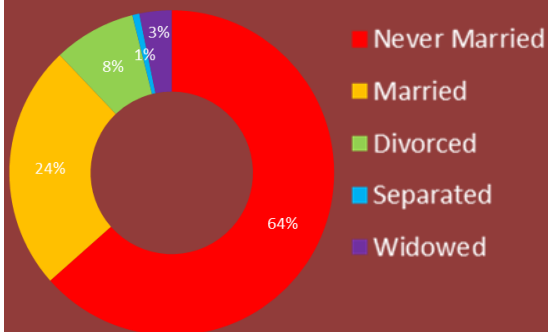
Most populous city in Vermont and the seat of Chittenden County
