



Dunlap is the county seat of Sequatchie County, Tennessee. Just a few years ago, 17 of the 30 downtown commercial buildings were empty. Now, only one or two remain vacant as investors have stepped up and opened shops, eateries, and B&Bs in the

restored buildings. The natural beauty of the area is now complimented by a walkable downtown that has hopes to not only attract visitors, but also create a sense of community among the residents of Dunlap.




Community is something that the Tennessee Valley Presbytery would

Dunlap Highlights

About 45 minutes north of Chattanooga and 2 hours southeast of Nashville.

Several festivals, including
a bluegrass festival, are held at the
Dunlap Coke Ovens Park every year.

Savage Gulf State Natural Area is located atop the Cumberland Plateau to the west and Prentice Cooper State Forest is located atop the plateau to the east.

Often referred to as the "Hang Gliding Capital of the East" & home to the East Coast Hang Gliding Championships.

The McMinn County Living Heritage
Museum houses more than 10,000
artifacts in 30 permanent exhibits that
represent the culture and history of
Southeast Tennessee from the 1700's to
the present.
