



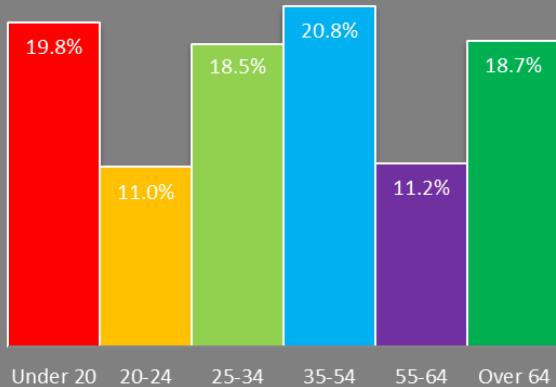

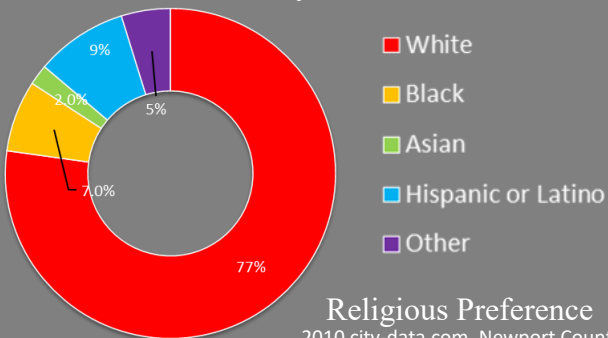

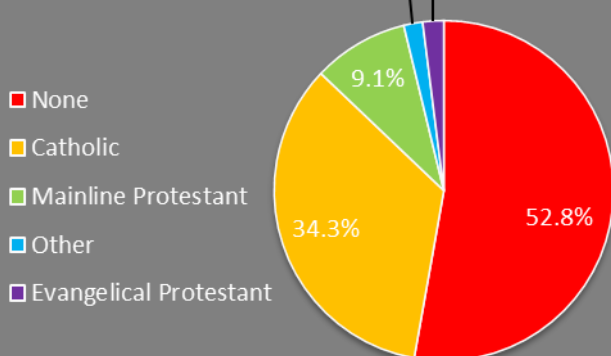


Racial/Ethnic Diversity

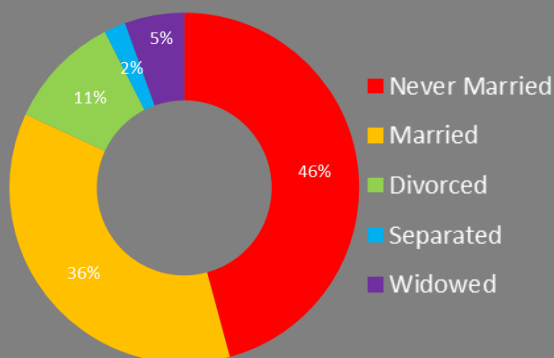
