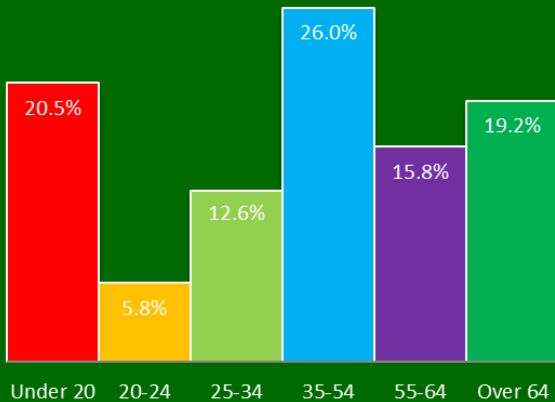

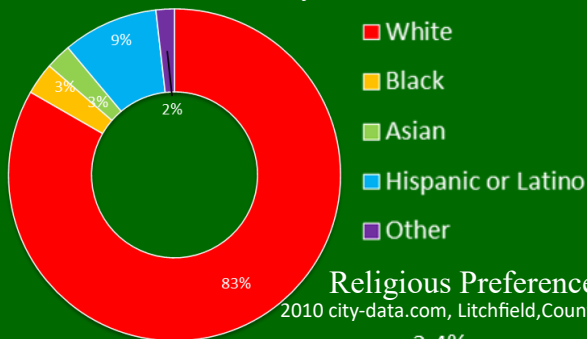

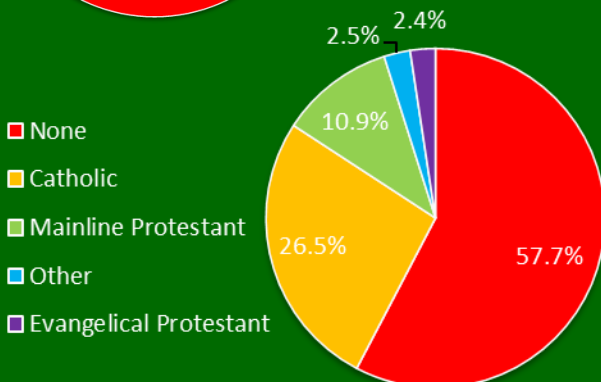


Racial/Ethnic Diversity

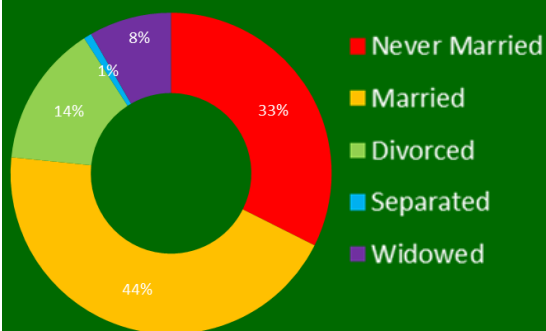
